The ideal candidate will have strong stakeholder management skills (both internally and externally), and an ability to develop and implement strategic and operational plans. They will also have high-level project planning, management, asset management and contract administration knowledge.





Gunnedah Shire known as “The Koala Capital” of the world has a population of approximately 12,826 residents and covers an area of approximately 4,994 square kilometres.

Gunnedah Shire is a local government area in the North West Slopes region of New South Wales. The Shire is located adjacent to the Liverpool Plains in the Namoi River Valley and is traversed by the Oxley Highway and the Kamilaroi Highway. The Shire is located about 450 kilometres north of the Sydney CBD, and about 650 kilometres south of the Brisbane CBD.



The main employment sectors in Gunnedah Shire include agriculture and mining, as well as retail, healthcare, and education. The area is known for its production of wheat, cotton, and livestock, as well as its coal mining industry.

Gunnedah Shire Council is composed of nine councillors elected proportionally as a single ward. All Councillors are elected for a fixed four-year term of office. The mayor is elected by the councillors at the first meeting of the council.

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
